

Cultivate A Career In Horticulture Certificate IV In Horticulture (Turf)

Certificate IV In Horticulture (Turf) RTF 40803



This course is ideal for people working with turf areas such as sporting facilities and large recreation areas. If supervising staff, planning the routine operations and assisting with the management of sports turf areas is what you do or would like to do, this qualification is for you.

Students who enrol in this course must be employed in a Horticultural workplace. You could complete the full Certificate IV in Horticulture within two (2) years. Depending on you and your employers needs, learning may be held at your workplace, at a TSI campus in Clarence, Alanvale or Burnie, or at an agreed destination.

Course Results and Skills Gained: The course has been designed to give student options for course content. There is more emphasis on the technical and theoretical aspects of turf management in this qualification than in Certificate III. Students may choose options such as: preparing budgets for small projects, supervising staff on routine and special projects, planning and implementing fertiliser and chemical use and planning the maintenance of turf areas.
